Beyond his professional accomplishments, Buddy has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to service. He has served as a board member for various organizations, including All Things Possible Ministries, which is committed to liberating captives worldwide from physical and emotional abuse. He also serves on the Board of Directors for Skull Games, a non-profit organization aimed at protecting individuals, with a focus on women, children, and vulnerable populations, from sexual exploitation. To date, Skull Games has identified over 150 exploited women and provided information on over 75 traffickers to law enforcement. His forward-thinking approach to intelligence, coupled with his enthusiasm for technological progression continues to feed his entrepreneurial endeavors.
